Shocking levels of restrictive practices

3,590

Within October 2020

reported uses of restrictive interventions in one month e.g. **physical, chemical, mechanical restraint** and being **kept in isolation**.

Of these, **520** were against **Children** (under 18s)

The number of children with a learning disability and/or autism in inpatient units has **increased** since the start of the Transforming Care programme.

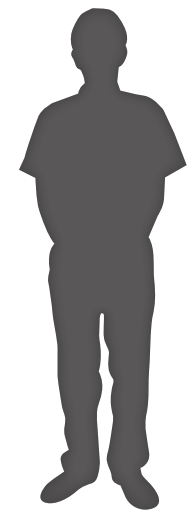

Mental Health Act reform

However, law reform is not enough. We need investment in the right community support **now**.

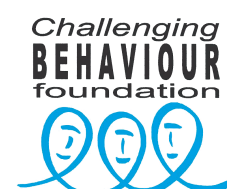
COVID-19 makes Transforming Care even more of a priority, not less
