The number of children with a learning disability and/or autism in inpatient units has **more than doubled** since the start of the Transforming Care programme.

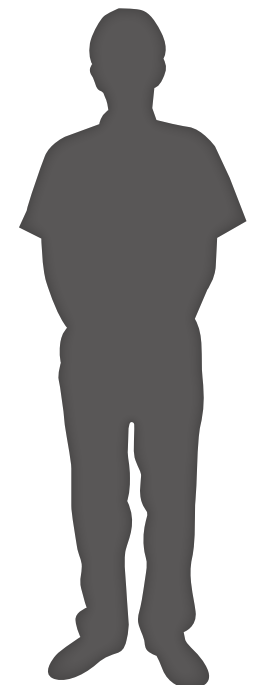
