The importance of self-advocacy led campaigns

- Self-advocates need to be in charge of campaigns
- Equal partners and equal leaders
- Self-advocates know what the solutions are
- Service providers and family forums need to work with and to selfadvocates and become their allies.
- Decision makers need to work with and listen to what self-advocates have to say.

Being an ally as a self-advocate

- Not all of the leaders in the Right2Home campaign have lived experience of ATUs
- Lots of us have fought for good support, without it we could be in ATUs too
- They want to stand in solidarity with other people with a learning disability
- We know some people have traumatic experiences and don't want to speak up
- We want to help raise their voices
- Our values: listen to us, hear our voices... nothing about us without us!
