Standard parenting courses not suitable for families of children with learning disabilities. Tailored support is needed. Families reported feeling "abandoned" after diagnosis. Walsall have recently commissioned the development of early intervention support for families, but this is not yet reflected across the whole of the Black Country due to capacity.	Introduce early intervention support, potentially in the form of the Early Positive Approaches to Support programme (EPAtS).
