#### The aim of the workshop is:

 To discuss what funding is needed and what funding opportunities are available to include in an alternative action plan which delivers good outcomes

#### **Background**

An action plan that will deliver results for people with learning disabilities whose behaviour challenges will require funding. This cost will need to be estimated for the actions in the plan, which will take time. This workshop gives an opportunity to begin considering what funding options are available.

The BTRS Action Plan includes multiple commitments relating to funding (see appendix A).
